Year in Review...

Last March (2017), we prayerfully closed the chapter of ministry at the Bible Institute and Camp facility. Jeremiah 29:11 Ministries is purchasing it. They are thrilled to be living in a safer location that seems perfectly suited to their ministry to children and young people with extreme physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual needs. Fortysix children and youth from various backgrounds are cared for and receive Bible nurturing and teaching on this property.



In the **summer of 2017**, we ventured to the States for a four-month furlough. We shared with sixteen of our supporting churches in seven states. We were the visiting missionaries for a 3rd and 4th grade camp. It was a pleasure to share what God is doing in Honduras and to spark an interest in missions. We also visited several friends who have served as missionaries in Honduras and now live in the States. We listened as they shared their challenges in transition and what God is doing in their lives today. We were grateful to be able to see many of you over the summer!


