Baptism – Mark & Helen have been attending the church for a number of years. Both are confined to wheelchairs. They are amazing in so many ways – their attitude towards life is always positive, they know so many people in the town and they are often going off on holidays.

Helen had expressed a desire to be baptised several years ago, but at that time, she was undergoing surgery and we had no means of getting her in and out of the water at our church.

Burrswood, is a Christian health and wellbeing centre with a hydrotherapy pool with a hoist to help physically challenged people get in and out of the pool. Helen shared her testimony at our morning worship service - such a woman of faith, in spite of so much adversity. Later that afternoon, we went to Burrswood and had a short baptismal service and with the help of 2 of our ladies who work in the caring profession and the physiotherapist at Burrswood, we got Helen in to the pool and baptised her. She glowed with the love of Jesus. Afterwards, we all shared together in a cream tea at the local tea room. Helen and Mark are a continual inspiration to us all as they radiate faith and love, despite the challenges they face.





Visitors from the US - We were blessed to have a team from the Dayspring Church in Fort Collins, CO with us in early July. Daniel & Christie Herrington and Royce & Megan Cline blessed us so much during their time with us. They helped us with our Soup Bowl, with our after-school club, they engaged in prayer walking our community, they went out with the Street Pastors, they were involved in preaching, teaching, in talking with people about Jesus in our shopping district.
