

Helping them with the ABCs Alphabets, Bricks and Churches

As we deal with melting snow and rising waters after a wet winter in the US, our Lele friends are in West Africa are still in dry season.

The pictures Pierre has been sending us recently tell us that this dry season is about the ABC's—Alphabets, Bricks and Churches.

Alphabets—Pierre and his wife Elisabeth have been teaching literacy classes each Sunday afternoon in our village.

About 20 students of all ages came to the first class a few weeks ago and more and more villagers want to join. Pierre says they really need to train more teachers to help all the Lele people wanting to read and write in their own language.

With reading classes underway, imagine all the people who will be able to read Bible scripture text as we get it translated!

Bricks—Dry season is the season for making bricks for houses. This year in our village and in the neighboring one they are making bricks for new church building constructions.

Construction of a new church building in the neighboring village. It will be time to put on a roof in just a few weeks. Can you help us get wood and tin for their roof?

The neighboring village had a small church building before, but it began to cave in at the end of the last rainy season. So church members are diligently working to put together a new building before the big rains begins in April and May. The situation is getting a bit urgent since the bricks are of the simple sunbaked mud variety. Thus, this small church of 20 or so believers is looking for help in paying for wood and tin roof to put on it very soon. We want to help, but we do not have enough to do this project and help with the needs in the other Lele churches.

Can you help us pay for some roof tin to add to the bricks these villagers are making so we can get a building put together before rainy season? Churches—The Lele church is growing! The few Lele churches that have sparked up among this unreached people group are real lighthouses that can help people find their way to Jesus.

Lele believers are beginning to sense the need to be missionaries to their neighbors, the many unreached villages who still haven't heard the good news—among the Lele and among other neighboring language groups.
