We are excited to have Dr. Adriana Naranjo join our staff! She is responsible for the healthcare of all of our children and gives basic treatment to our staff.

She is also leading the mobile medical mission. We have been serving five villages in the mountains. Many of these villages do not have regular health care. At times, these clinics are staffed by short term mission groups. Other times, our staff and some of the older kids go to help staff the clinics.

Hundreds of people are hearing the gospel and receiving basic medical care through these clinics.

It is wonderful that our young people also have the opportunity to be missionaries in the mountains of Mexico!

Your generosity saves lives

Discarded on a pile of trash in an empty lot just days before Christmas. How can this be possible? It made me angry when I first heard about it. Then I tried to reason it out. Perhaps it was like the story of baby Moses. His mother put her infant son into a basket of reeds as the best way to protect him. His sister Miriam was posted nearby to make sure he was found and taken care of. Surely this was the same? Perhaps his mama wrapped him in a warm blanket and asked his sister Maria to stay nearby to make sure that he was going to be okay. Sadly that was not the case.

Job Benjamin really was left to die. **Unwanted - discarded - rejected.** The good news is that the authorities found him and brought him to Niños de México on December 15, 2009. Since that





time, he has grown into a wonderful boy who understands that Jesus loves him, wants him, protects him, and will always be there for him!

"Benji" asked Jesus to be his personal Savior and was baptized on Easter! Best news ever! How is this possible? It is possible because supporters like you share the resources that God has put into your care. Through your generosity, Benji is able to see the love of Jesus firsthand through the many people who have surrounded him in his young life. Thank you!

NEW GIRLS' HOME IN PUEBLA

Enabling sibling groups to stay together

We are excited to announce that we are establishing a new girls home near our Casa de Niños boys home in Puebla.

Since the merger with Casa de Niños in 2015, we have seen the need for a girls' home in the same city as the boys' home. The majority of children we receive come as a part of a sibling group. All of our homes are separated by gender, and lacking a home for girls, the sisters end up living in different cities. This distance is an obstacle to keeping a close family bond.

The distance that Casa is from the majority of our homes offers safety to kids who could be in danger by being in close proximity to the people that had hurt them. By placing these children in a home several hours away, they have the freedom to begin to heal, without the worry of being found.

We will be opening Casa de Niños/New Beginnings at the end of June. Besides allowing these brothers and sisters the opportunity to spend more time together, this new home will also allow us to welcome children from nearby cities where there are children in great need.


We recently asked you to help provide all of the furnishings for this new home. Your response has helped us to reach that goal! \$18,228 has been

DON BADER PASSES AWAY APRIL 27, 2019

There are people who make an incredible mark on the lives of the people with whom they come in contact. Don & Vi Bader were those kind of people! They made a difference in the lives of the children of Niños de Mexico and with so many people who they met in their travels all across the U.S. Because of their dedication to the children, many of those people decided to support the children of Niños.

Don Bader passed away April 26, 2019, and our hearts go out to his family. Don will be remembered for his diligent work in leading the ministry and for raising the necessary funds to care for hundreds of children who were living without hope, direction, or any kind of future before coming to Niños de Mexico. His passion for caring for the children came across in every VBS program or church presentation that he created.

Don and his wife worked with the ministry of Niños de México for 17 years, starting in 1972. The ministry was relatively young at that time and they worked as Associate Directors, diligently



raising funds that allowed the ministry to continue to expand. Don became the Executive Director in 1978 and served in this capacity until 1987. He continued with the ministry as the Development Director until 1989. We are so thankful for his service to the ministry and the many kids who were blessed during his time in leadership.

Six children rescued


In late February we were approached about **welcoming** a family of four children into our homes. They range in age from two to twelve.

The children were badly abused and rescued by DIF. The kids were removed from where they were living and investigations are ongoing.

The children are adapting well to their new families and their new schools. Daniel was recently baptized into Christ.

In mid-May, we **welcomed** two more kids from the Mexico City area. They both come to us with broken bones from abuse that they suffered. Jesus is five years old and Katheryne is 1-½ years old.
